<u>Players, coaches, match officials –</u> Identify what activity or situations might cause transmission of the virus and likelihood above could be exposed	Player, coach, or match official arrives while unwell and transmits virus to surfaces or someone else.	We will use a temperature gun to take temperature of all participants entering the ground. On Training and Match Days, this includes away teams. Details of temperature will be logged with details of all participants for track and trace purposes. Players, coaches, match officials advised to self-assess and stay home if unwell. We have self assessment t forms that are completed before all training sessions and match days. Social distancing in line with government guidelines to be in place before and after games/training, in between game breaks, and on the side-line.	We will be in frequent contact with players and officials, who will be aware of their requirements to adhere to protocols and protect others.
<u>Players, coaches, match officials</u> – Travel to games and training	Social distancing is not observed if people used public transport or carpool to attend training or match days. Travelling to away games – the use of the club minibus may be used in the future when deemed safe to do so.	Participants should follow best practice for travel including minimising use of public transport and should instead walk or cycle if possible. People from a household or support bubble can travel together. If people are car sharing they need to have one in the rear and one in the front wearing face coverings.	Many of the players are local, so travel to games will not be an issue. For those travelling they will be aware of current guidance and have plenty of notice to arrange appropriate transport.

(see attached form to be used for each session and a log kept)</p>	N/A
<p><u>Players, coaches, match officials</u></p> <p>– Equipment</p>	<p>Equipment in frequent use:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Goalposts - Corner Flags - Balls - Gloves - Bottles - Kit 	<p>Hands to be thoroughly clean before and after games and during substitutions.</p> <p>Equipment not to be shared.</p> <p>All participants should sanitise hands regularly.</p> <p>Ball handling kept to minimum, balls disinfected regularly. If a ball comes out of play and an opportunity arises to change balls then this would be good practice and should be considered.</p> <p>Each individual to have own water bottle, no sharing/communal.</p> <p>Corner Flags and goalposts to be wiped down before and after use.</p>	N/A

		<p>Dug outs and benches to be sprayed and cleaned after use.</p> <p>Goalkeepers should ensure they disinfect their gloves regularly.</p> <p>Where possible, coaches should only handle the equipment.</p> <p>Players/Coaches/Officials to arrive dressed and ready to train/play where possible. If there is a need for a changing room, only 11 people permitted at any time. And to be cleaned after use by the team.</p> <p>Discussions with referees around 20 minute water breaks to allow for cleaning of equipment.</p>	
Spectators & Parents/ Guardians	Transmission of Covid-19 between individuals	<p>Spectators are now permitted to attend, this will be based on capacity i.e. phased approach from 15% to 30%, oppositions to set out distancing measures at the venue.</p> <p>Spectators may not be permitted to attend the game if this is an away game (alternative arrangements may be made to stream the game).</p> <p>If spectators are permitted to attend this will be based on the oppositions measures and capacity i.e. phased approach from 15% to 30%, oppositions to set out distancing measures at</p>	Covid-19 officers in place to support managers, coaches and staff

		<p>the venue.</p> <p>Parents will need to follow the opposing clubs measures and policy which may include being restricted to the bar for the duration of the game (maintaining social distance at all times) – this to be communicated prior to the game</p>	
<p><u>Players, coaches, match officials</u> – During sessions/games</p>	<p>Risk of transmittance through usual gameplay etiquette: - Celebrations - Handshakes/high-fives</p>	<p>Celebrations should be avoided/kept minimal.</p> <p>No handshakes after games.</p> <p>Social distancing to remain in place on side-lines/benches.</p>	N/A
<p><u>Car Park</u> – Hayworth Park</p>	<p>Social distancing is not observed as people congregate before entering premises.</p>	<p>Changing rooms closed so players encouraged to turn up in kit to reduce congregation and can remain outside.</p> <p>If changing rooms are needed by opposition , they can request this however they must adhere to the rules (no more than 11 people in the changing room at any time) face coverings inside must be worn. Changing rooms must be cleaned after use with spray which will be provided.</p> <p>Should the inside area/changing rooms need to be used in the event of rain or poor weather face coverings must be worn and hand sanitised before and after entering. No more than 11 people i n the changing room at one time.</p>	<p>Transitory lapses in social distancing in outside areas are less risky, the main risk is likely to be where people congregate or for vulnerable people.</p>
<p>Entrance hall/lobby/corridors</p>	<p>Possible busy areas where risk is social distancing not observed in a confined area.</p>	<p>One-way system to be created by HCLFC and Hayworth Park. One entrance and an exit.</p>	<p>Hand sanitiser to be checked daily by Hayworth Park and HCLFC</p>

	<p>People exposed to Covid 19 by touching door handles, light switches in frequent use</p>	<p>Signage to show people which way to go.</p> <p>2 metre spacing to be marked out in corridors.</p> <p>Door handles and light switches to be cleaned regularly.</p> <p>Hand sanitiser to be provided by HCLFC and Hayworth Park</p> <p>When leaving Haworth Park Social distancing must be observed. Use of Toilets	<p>Social distancing difficult.</p> <p>Surfaces in frequent use = door handles, light switches, basins, toilet handles, seats etc.</p>	<p>Mens and womens toilets to be for 2 people at a time only.</p> <p>Only 1 sink available for use in each toilet.</p> <p>Hirers/user groups using the building to clean all frequently touched surfaces before and after use. Posters to encourage 20 second hand washing.</p>	<p>Haworth Park to ensure that soap and toilet paper is replenished frequently.</p> <p>Haworth Park to ensure that the facullities are cleaned and ready for HCLFC to use for training and match days.</p> <p>HCLFC to clean after use.</p>
Use of club house and bar.	<p>Social distancing difficult</p> <p>Surfaces in frequent use, handles of doors, glasses in bar, chairs and tables.</p>	<p>Parents of under 18's are permitted if (absolutely necessary) to wait in the bar/club house during matches and training. Social distancing will be observed and posters placed on walls and doors explaining the 2 meter rule. Face covering must be worn.</p> <p>We will encourage face coverings whilst in the bar/club house.</p>	<p>N/A</p>
